
itself as I had never been in a helicopter before.

Due to Omicron, this Gathering is now scheduled for $26^{th} - 29^{th}$ August. More information is to come hopefully next month.



Club leaders and members recently held a zoom meeting with Jeremi Snook. He advised FFI is now focusing on **rebuilding, recruiting and reaffirmation** of "a world of friends is a world of peace". Their budget for the year is now in place and FFI will not be requesting further donations. The plan is to rebuild journeys for 2023, which will include a world conference and to concentrate on building membership. The new Global Membership will be part of this drive as well as utilizing new technology.

Jeremi has advised that the FFI membership dues and the \$45 payment in lieu of FFI journey fees (both of which will be paid by our Club) for the current year will be extended through to the end of 2023. This recognises the fact that we are in the midst of a pandemic and won't be able to hold many journeys this year to take advantage of the free domestic fees.
