An Open Letter from FFI Board Chair

Friendship Force International, Donna Simek

Dear Friendship Force Family,

In a world that sometimes feels more divided than united, our mission—to promote world peace and understanding by creating an environment where individual friendships can be established across the barriers that separate people —has never been more important.
